

Ara Sargsyan (1902-1969) & Hakob Kojoian (1883-1959)

The house museum of sculptor Ara Sarksyian and painter/illustrator Hakop Kojoyan at 70 Pushkin Street is a two-storey structure where they lived and created.

It opened in 1973 as a branch of the National Gallery of Art in Yerevan. The collection includes some of their private possessions and memorabilia, instruments and unfinished works. Their works are presented in thematic and chronological sequence.



The ground floor displays works by

Ara Sargsyan, including photographs of his early works, some of which are in various private collections. Included are *Mother Armenia*, *Sahak Partev and Mesrop Mashtotz*, and *Hiroshima*, as well as busts of Stepan Shahumyan, Raffi, and others.



Kojoyan's more than 250 works are on the second floor together with his personal belongings and original book illustrations for such writers as M. Gorki, E. Charents and A. Bakunts.
