

Paruyr Sevag (1924-1971)

Sevag's house museum is located in his hometown of Zangakatun, in Ararat Province. This is where his home, museum and grave memorial are located.



The home is still owned by the family and is not regularly open to the public.

The museum was constructed in the 1970s, next to his home.

The glass cases in the museum display his works translated into Russian, Hungarian, German, Spanish, Polish, Estonian, Georgian, and a large mural painted by Sarkis Muradian, a Yerevan

artist, tells the story of Sevag's life. An outspoken critic of soviet corruption, he died in a questionable car accident in 1971, together with his wife.
